ADMISSION GUIDELINES FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2024/2025

These Guidelines stand as guidance on process and procedure of application, admission and registration as TaSUBa student. It highlights the key items on the programme offered, minimum admission eligibility criteria, course duration and award as well as cost per programme. It also discloses the procedures for dissatisfied non-admitted applicant to be adhered for remedial measures.

Furthermore, the Guidelines briefly highlight to the admitted and registered students the tolerable mode of life and governing Regulations during the training for monitoring and adherence.

The admitted and registered students are advised to get acquainted and be conversant with the formulated regulations and Guidelines and comply in due course of pursuing studies to become a trained profession better artist.

(1) General Introduction

(a) Institutional Establishment, Mandate and Location

Taasisi ya Sanaa na Utamaduni Bagamoyo (TaSUBa) (formerly Bagamoyo College of Arts), is a dynamic semi-autonomous Government Executive Agency established pursuant to Government Notice No. 220 of 2007 made under the Executive Agencies Act, Cap. 245. The Institute situates at the offshore of the Indian Ocean, Plot No. 289-291, Block "P" alongside Kaole road within Bagamoyo urban area about 66km northward from Dar es Salaam City. It performs its functions of developing, preserving and promoting Tanzania arts and culture under the Ministry of Culture, Arts and Sports. For the purposes of maintaining services quality assurance, the College is under the oversight of the National Council for Technical and Vocational Education Training (NACTVET) and is accredited and registered by the same under registration number REG/PWF/010.

(b) Institutional Objectives

The main aim for Institutional establishment is to develop, preserve and promote Tanzanian arts and culture and impart the knowledge of the same to the existing and future generations. To meet such statutory objectives, TaSUBa roles and functions are as follows: -

- (i) To provide high quality training programs in the area of arts and culture.
- (ii) To provide consultancy services in the area of arts and culture.
- (iii)To conduct research in the area of arts and culture.

(3) Application and Admission Procedures

(a) Application Procedures

(i) For Long Courses Programmes

- ✓ For Local and Foreigners (In Service and out of service and out of Secondary school):

 An eligible applicant shall download an Application Form from our website at www.tasuba.ac.tz or physically collect from the College and properly fill and submit the duly completed Form either physically to the College or by way of an e-mail address via application@tasuba.ac.tz;
- ✓ **For Direct Entry from Secondary School** (*Form four level*): Fill Selform at the School and the selected student will be directly posted by OR-TAMISEMI.

(ii) For Short Courses Programmes (Tailor Made Courses)

✓ An eligible applicant shall physically collect an Application Form from the College upon payment of non-refundable fee and properly fill and submit the duly completed Form physically to the College and upon payment of tuition fee and direct cost be admitted and registered and begins training.

(b) Admission Procedures to Long Courses Programmes

(i) All Applications shall be screened by the College Admission Committee and all names of the eligible and posted Applicants shall be uploaded to online system under the National Council for Technical and Vocational Education Training (NACTVET) for verification. The Admission Committee comprises of person with the following qualification: -

- (ii) All the verified and selected Applicants shall be notified by posting their names to the College website at www.tasuba.ac.tz and through Institutional social media platforms and other media platform as well as calling through phone number entered in their Application Forms.
- (iii) The selected Applicants shall be required to download Admission Letter attached with Joining Instruction Form from the College website at www.tasuba.ac.tz and adhere with instruction accordingly.
- (iv) The selected candidate shall be required to report to the College at the beginning of the academic year on the date specified in the admission letter.
- (v) The reported Applicants will be registered and issued with registration number upon adherence to Joining Instructions and payment of direct cost and Tuition fees at the prescribed acceptable installment rate.
- (vi) The registered students shall be oriented before beginning the training so as to understand and make acquainted to the College training environment and administration system.

(4) Admission for Discontinued Students

- (a) Any student who is discontinued from studies shall not be admitted to the same training programme which he/she is discontinued until after the lapse of one year.
- (b) Notwithstanding the condition set forth under paragraph 4 (a), such student may be admitted to any other programme if meets the minimum eligibility entry qualifications.

(5) Admission for Student with Disciplinary Dismissal

Any student who is discontinued from studies for disciplinary grounds by any College shall not be eligible for admission to any programme until after the lapse of two clear years.

(6) Appeal and Complaint Mechanism for non-admitted aggrieved Applicant

- (a) Any non-admitted dissatisfied Applicant, may within seven (07) days from date of publishing the names of the admitted eligible Applicants, lodge an appeal to the Principal explicitly stating grounds of appeal and requested remedy.
- (b) The Principal together with Admission Committee shall scrutinize the grounds of Appeal and dispose the findings within 14 working days.

(7) Guidance to the Admitted and Registered Students

(a) Adherence to the Formulated Regulations and Guidelines

- (i) Each student must as soon as possible upon admission and registration make familiar with the formulated Regulations and Guidelines including Student by laws and Examinations Regulations and programme training time table and adhere accordingly.
- (ii) All admitted and registered students are advised to be conversant and comply with all College Regulations and Guidelines and thoroughly comply.
- (iii) All students at the College are governed and guided by the established Regulations and Guidelines and any alleged violation shall be investigated and the suspect be charged in accordance to the violated provision of the respective regulation and upon conviction accordingly punished and disciplined.

(b) Accommodations

- (i) There is no satisfactory accommodation for all students at the College hostel and the priority and consideration is for disables.
- (ii) It is highly advisable for each student to make personal accommodation arrangement and if necessary, with the assistance of the Office of the Students' Union Government (UWATaSUBa) or Dean of Students.

(c) Dressing Code

Dressing code for all admitted and registered students are as ascribed in the Student by-laws and Examination Regulations.

(d) Remittance of Fee

The Institute shall not be liable to refund the paid fee or any cost to any Postponing or discontinued admitted and registered student. However, if the claim is made within the first month of the training after registration, and upon adducing good acceptable reason(s) on satisfaction of the Management, save for paid direct cost, one third of the full paid tuition fee will be refunded.

(8) Scope of the Guidelines

These Guidelines are set purposely and specifically for the academic year 2024/25. They are subject to the Regulator's directives (NACTVET), and they change in each academic year hence terms and conditions herein set forth may slightly vary accordingly.
